Use of Telephone

All after school arrangements need to be made by children and parents before arriving at school on any given day. Students will not be able to use the phone to make after school arrangements. Phone calls during the day will not be transferred to students.

Cell Phone Procedures

Students are discouraged from bringing cell phones to school. While students are permitted to bring phones with them to school, phones may not be on a student's person between the school's start and dismissal times. During school hours, phones must be either checked in with staff for safekeeping or kept in the students's book bag.

Please Leave Electronic Devices at Home!

Electronic devices may not be brought to school or Club 66. These include iPods, MP3 players, portable DVD players, video games, handheld games, etc. Thank you for following this guideline.

Arrangements

Please send a note to your child's teacher if you are picking up your child early in the day or have a change in transportation arrangements. It is difficult to notify the students and teachers during the school day **especially last minute calls after 3:00 p.m.** Thanks for your help!

School Arrival

Our school day begins at 8:40 a.m. Students not in their classrooms at 8:40 a.m. will be marked tardy. Students may enter the building at 8:30 a.m. We ask that students not arrive before 8:30 a.m. unless:

- participating in a school activity
- serving on Safety Patrol
- working with a teacher
- attending Club "66" Before & After school care program
- participating in school breakfast

Leaving During The School Day

Students leaving during the school day for appointments, illness or other events must be checked out by a parent or guardian. For students' safety, we do not allow them to wait outside for a parent. When your child returns from an appointment, a parent or guardian must sign them back in at the office.

A Gentle Reminder

We understand that some medical appointments cannot be avoided. However, it is disruptive to a child's day and to the classroom when students leave during class time. We request that you try to make appointments outside of the school hours when possible. Thank you!

Attendance



Each school day begins with taking attendance. It is very important that students be in their classrooms by 8:40 a.m. so they are not missed during this procedure. Please have students arrive at school at 8:30 a.m. so they can be in their classrooms at 8:40 a.m. We will also take attendance immediately following the lunch recess, which again means that if students leave campus for lunch with parents, that they need to be back when that attendance is taken. Our school secretary will call the home or work of parents who have not called in and reported their child's absence. Please help us with this by calling in by 8:40 a.m. when your student is not coming to school.

Students coming in **after** attendance has been taken either in the morning or at noon must **stop at the office and sign in on the attendance sheet.** Students coming or going during the day for appointments, illness, etc. must also sign in and out through the office. There are no exceptions.

I appreciate the staffs' dedication to this process and thank you for your cooperation in this matter. We all are committed to making things as secure as possible for everyone at Swanson.

Swanson and all schools in our District are now in year two of our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) implementation plan. PBIS is a process to increase student achievement, school attendance, and academic success while decreasing challenging student behaviors. The goal is to provide a positive learning environment, influence, and reinforcement to all by focusing on our guiding behavior expectations school wide. Breakfast in the Mornings!

Westside Nutrition Services is hosting Breakfast at Swanson Elementary. Studies show breakfast reduces behavior and health problems and increases academic achievement. To encourage participation in this program, all children at Swanson can enjoy breakfast in the lunchroom at 8:20 a.m. Breakfast is \$1.50 with a reduced price of 30 cents for students who qualify for reduced lunch. Online Lunch Payment System

Westside Nutrition Services is pleased to have an on-line payment system MySchoolBucks (myschoolbucks.com) to fund lunch accounts. You will have 24/7 computer and mobile access to view balances, make payments and monitor your child(ren)'s purchase history. You will be able to set low balance reminders and receive e-mail confirmation that your payment was received. This system accepts credit cards, debit cards and even lets you pay with checks. MySchoolBucks is certified by VISA for its CISP/Cardholder Information Security program.

Lunch/Breakfast Menu

Westside Nutrition Services has an online, interactive menu. We are partnered with LunchTray.com. This menu platform will enable students, parents, and guardians to access a full array of information related to Nutrition Service's offerings and menus. Westside Community users will be able to access Free and Reduced meal applications and link to MySchoolBucks.com to access students funding.

Two Parent Households

Medication Administration Policy



The school district will not purchase, prescribe, or provide any medication for any student.

To facilitate the safe administration of medications in school, parents are requested to use the appropriate medication permission form.

Before any prescribed medications will be administered at school, the AUTHORIZATION FOR ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION AT SCHOOL FORM must be signed by both the physician and the parent.

Prescription medications must be brought to school in the prescription bottle, labeled with the student's name, the date, the medication name, the time, and the dose that is to be given. Most pharmacies will provide you with an extra-labeled bottle upon your request.

Non-prescription medications and ointments (i.e. cough syrup, cough drops, cold medicine, Vaseline, Tylenol/Ibuprofen/Benadryl, Neosporin, lotions, etc.) must be brought to school in the original bottle/box/container, with the time and dose to be given noted on the signed AUTHORIZATION FOR ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION AT SCHOOL FORM. For the safety of all students, these medications must be kept in the locked cupboard in the health office.

Please keep this information available for use in the event your child will need to take medication during school hours. Please arrange medication administration outside of school hours, whenever possible.

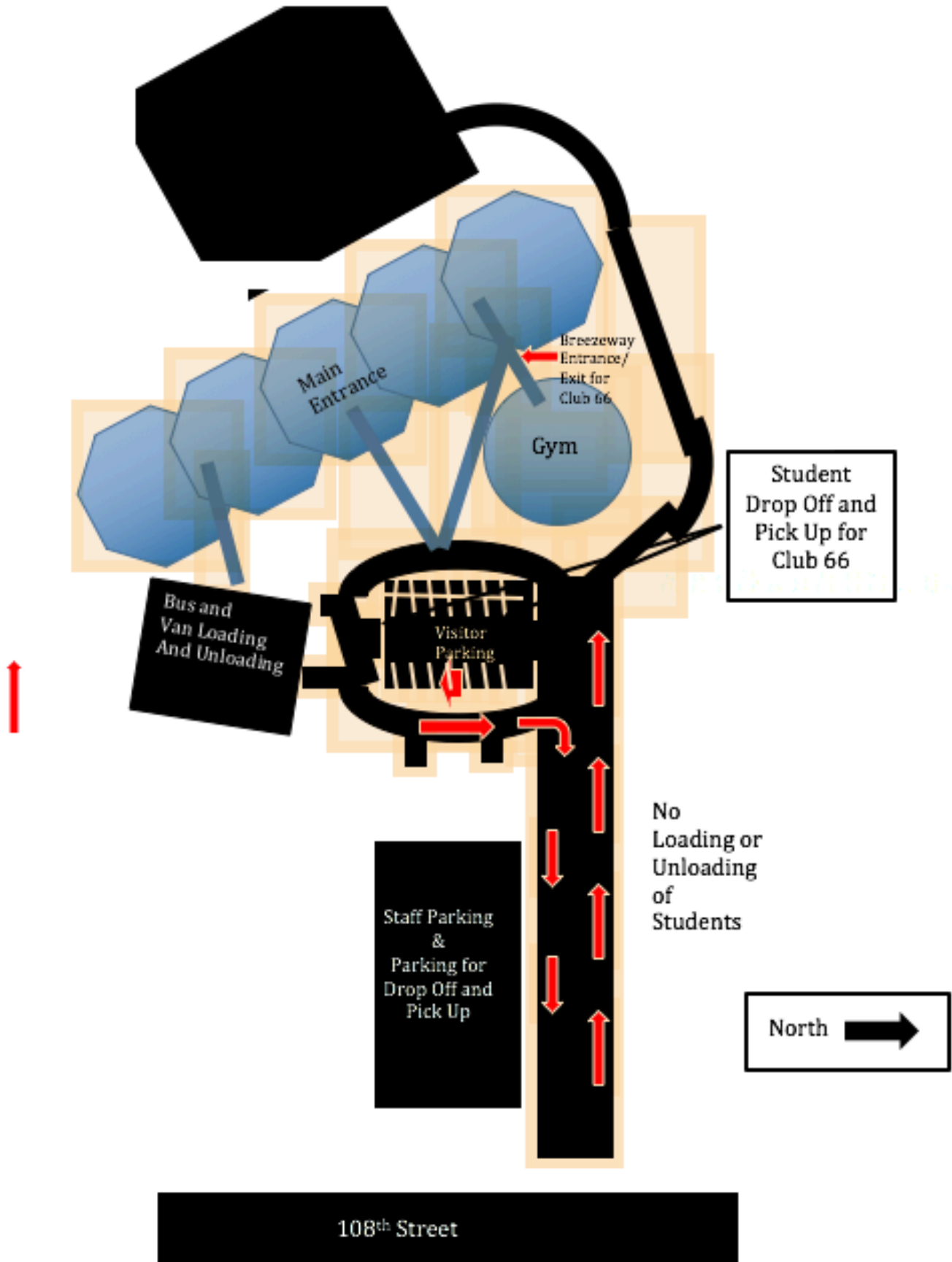

Swanson Map and Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures



Swanson Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

- * Students can be dropped off starting at 8:25 a.m. each morning unless attending Club 66 or breakfast
- * Breakfast is served starting at 8:20 a.m. each morning. Breakfast students enter through the breeze way doors
- * First bell rings at 8:30 a.m. and the tardy bell rings at 8:40 a.m.
- * All students arriving after 8:40 a.m. must check in at the front office
- * School dismisses at 3:30 p.m. (3:00 p.m. on Wednesdays)
- * Students are to go directly home after dismissal unless they attend Club 66
- * Instruction occurs until dismissal time every day – picnic tables and shade trees are plentiful for parents to wait for their child(ren)
- * The drop off and pick up line for parent cars starts on the north side of the street as you enter the property from 108th Street
- * Unloading and loading of cars will only take place directly south of Student Loading and Unloading Zone
- * After school pick up will be designated by grade level along the sidewalk. Students will line up on the curb by grade.
- * Please unload and load cars from curb side or passenger car doors
- * The loop around the parking lot and center of the loop is one-way traffic only
- * The center of the loop is for visitor parking only, no drop off traffic
- * If you park in the parking lot, please walk your child to and from the building
- * Please do not wave your child to walk through the parking lot to your car
- * Please drive slowly and cautiously, refraining from cell phone use for the safety of our students
- * Please park in designated spots only, not along the curb, behind parked cars, or blocking traffic flow
- * If needed, extra bus and handicapped van loading and unloading will take place near the south curb in front of the building. At these times, we will load and unload students north of the crosswalk only.
- * Teachers remain with their students until 3:40 p.m. (3:10 p.m. on Wednesdays) so you do not have to arrive early to wait in line
- * Please contact the front office if you are expecting to arrive late

Student safety patrol officers in bright colored vests and staff are present from approximately 3:30-3:40 p.m. each day to help with safety. If you would like to help monitor drop off and pick up times, please call the school to volunteer. Thank you for your cooperation in this important safety matter.

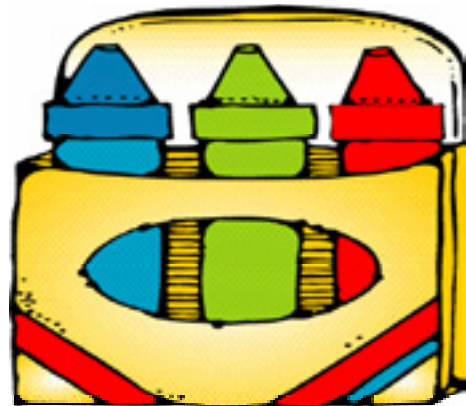
